

PUT A ROCK IN THEIR SHOE

Allen Crostic grew up in a strong, Christian family but admits he had doubts during his late teen/early college years. "I really started to think critically about my faith... I wasn't sure what I believed or if God existed... I came out of that whole process helped tremendously by apologetics. That became a real passion of mine. I went to seminary later on and got my Masters of Arts in Apologetics."

Allen recently taught a workshop at the Richmond Noble Man conference largely drawing from Greg Koukl's book, *Tactics:* A Game Plan for Discussing Your Christian Convictions. Allen shared ways to help maneuver through those difficult conversations with Gospel intention. But he said, if guys only remember one thing from his workshop it would be this:

"So many times, we think we need to be on the defense. That's not true... It's not your job to disprove their claim, it's their job to prove it."

And for the guys who still feel anxious about sharing their faith, Allen gives this helpful analogy from Greg Koukl...

"Sharing our faith is like baseball. When someone gets up to go bat their immediate goal is not to win the game. They realize that's an extended process that takes team effort. Their immediate goal is to get a hit and connect with the ball. So, my goal isn't to "lead them to the cross" every time. If that happens, great!...

...But my immediate goal is to put a rock in their shoe, to give them something worth thinking about, something to poke at them in a good way because they can't ignore it."
